INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Executive Board of Tongariro Natural History Society Incorporated

Report on the Performance Report

We have audited the performance report of Tongariro Natural History Society Incorporated on pages 3 to 21 which comprises the entity information, the statement of service performance, the statement of financial performance, statement of movements in equity and statement of cash flows for the year ended 30 June 2023, the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2023, and the statement of accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our Opinion

a) the reported outcomes and outputs, and quantification of the outputs to the extent practicable, in the statement of service performance are suitable;

b) except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the accompanying performance report on pages 3 to 21 presents fairly, in all material respects,

- the entity information for the year then ended;
- the service performance for the year then ended; and
- the financial position of Tongariro Natural History Society Incorporated as at 30 June 2023, and its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended, in accordance with Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting – Accrual (Not-For-Profit) issued by the New Zealand Accounting Standards Board.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

In common with similar organisations, control over certain revenues (donations and fundraising) of the organisation prior to being recorded is limited, and there are no practical audit procedures to determine the effect of this limited control.

We have confirmed total funding received through external third-party confirmations. Grant funding is not disclosed in the financial statements separately by funder as required per the funding agreements.

Income in advance is based on the overall income and expenditure for each project undertaken by the organisation, irrespective of whether the funding has a 'use or return' condition attached. There may therefore be material misstatements in the income in advance balances and the related revenue balances, depending on the conditions attached to the various funding streams.

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The comparative period was not audited, and no audit procedures have been performed over the opening balances for the 2023 reporting period. Accordingly, the comparative figures as presented in the financial statements for year ended 30 June 2022 may contain material misstatements that could impact the statement of financial performance as reported for the year ended 30 June 2023. We were unable to determine whether any adjustments were necessary in respect to the opening balances.

We conducted our audit of the statement of financial performance, statement of financial position, statement of cash flows, statement of accounting policies and notes to the performance report in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand) (ISAs (NZ)), and the audit of the entity information and statement of service performance in accordance with the International Standard on Assurance Engagements (New Zealand) ISAE (NZ) 3000 (Revised).

Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Performance Report section of our report. We are independent of Tongariro Natural History Society Incorporated in accordance with Professional and Ethical Standard 1 (Revised) Code of Ethics for Assurance Practitioners issued by the New Zealand Auditing and Assurance Standards Board, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Other than in our capacity as auditor we have no relationship with, or interests in, Tongariro Natural History Society Incorporated.

Description of Entity's Outcomes

Project Tongariro was established in 1984 as a memorial organisation with a mission to enhance the values of Tongariro National Park. In the years since, we have greatly extended that role, to become the central North Island's largest conservation organisation. We aim to initiate and facilitate conservation opportunities in any way we are able. We collaborate with government organisations and other conservation groups to achieve these aims. Based on the success of our Kids Greening Taupō programme, our Executive Board has a growing belief that conservation education for children is key to enabling children and their families to engage with nature. Basis of Preparation

The entity has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

The Performance Report is presented in New Zealand dollars and all amounts are rounded to the nearest dollar.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The entity is registered for GST. All amounts are stated exclusive of goods and services tax (GST) except for accounts payable and accounts receivable which are stated inclusive of GST.

Income Tax

Project Tongariro is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable for the sale of goods and services, to the extent it is probable that the economic benefits to the society and revenue can be reliably measured.

Sales of services are recognised in the period by reference to the stage of completion of the transaction at the end of the reporting period.

Interest received is recognised as interest accrues.

Donations and grants received are recorded when received. Unused donations and grants having a "use or return" condition attached are deferred until such time as the conditions are fulfilled.

Expenses

Expenses have been classified on their business function.

Property, Plant & Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is recognised at cost less aggregated depreciation. Historical cost includes expenditure directly attributable to the acquisition of assets, and includes the cost of replacements that are eligible for capitalisation when these are incurred.

All other repairs and maintenance are recognised as expenses in the Statement of Financial Performance in the financial period n which they are incurred.

Depreciation has been calculated using the maximum rates permitted by the Income Tax Act 2007.





Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. Policies have been applied on a consistent basis with those of the previous reporting period.
